## **President's Day Trivia Night NEW NIGHT and DATE!** Friday, February 23, 2024





## Callaway Chalkboards Tells History of Public Schools (excerpt from book)

"The foundation for public education in Callaway County was laid by 116 rural school Districts. It's a story that needs to be told and celebrated. With each passing generation, the memories of rural one-room schoolhouses and the essential role they played in the evolution of Callaway County's public education system move farther away from our consciousness. Their importance to the very fabric of our communities cannot be overstated."

"Human nature tells us that most people have a burning desire to see their children and grandchildren live a better life than they had. The prevailing thought for families in the late 1800s and early 1900s - and arguably more embedded in the Black families of that time - was that education was the key to unlocking a better future. Families were convinced that educated children stood a better chance to escape the poverty, illiteracy, and isolation that had been holding many of them back for decades."



"To accomplish this objective, counties like Callaway were determined to expand the role of education beyond the private boarding schools of the mid-1800s to small, rural public schools that were within walking or riding distance of nearly every school-age child." ## WEANT SHARES MORE CALLAWAY HISTORY

Kenneth Weant, our ardent researcher friend in Texas, has produced two new books covering the 1860s. They are titled "Missourians in the Civil War" Volume 100 and Volume 101. Volume #100 contains 3933 names while #101 lists 4,294 names in the indexes. The Research Center has copies of these books for those wishing to view their contents. Weant has published many books containing indexes of microfilm. If you are unable to come to the Research Center to view theses new books, call us and we can give you details on his works and how to obtain copies.

Weant has gleaned the valuable information from previously unreadable microfilm of local newspapers. New equipment and other newspaper sources have allowed him to give us more information than just Civil War articles. In these new volumes, we find public notices that include administration filings, final distribution of probate cases, dissolution of partnerships, mortgagee sales which not only include land but personal property such as slaves to name a few. There are also marriages, obituaries and 'not responsible for a spouse's debt' notices.

The Civil War information includes such things as the Military Oaths and Bonds, stating those named who were required to report to the Provost Marshall, give the oath of allegiance and give a bond. You will find an article about the Callaway men wounded at Wilson Creek and other scrimmages. There is a long list of those exempt from service in 1864 along with a short list of those enrolled for duty in that year.

#### Here are two examples of stories that gave us previously unknown information.



This information from the Fulton Telegraph helped solve a long-standing mystery at Hillcrest Cemetery. Researchers had long wondered why three soldiers from the Battle of Moore's Mill were buried in that cemetery (aka Fulton Cemetery). Here is the answer.

#### FULTON TELEGRAPH – June 11, 1869

**Removing the Dead**– The Ladies of the Southern Aid Society request us to state that the remains of three unknown Confederate Soldiers were disinterred at Moore's Mill, in this county, and decently buried in the Fulton Cemetery northeast of town, on the 26th of May last. They also request us to state that the expenses attending their removal, digging graves etc., have been paid for out of the means in their hands, belonging to the Society.

#### MISSOURI TELEGRAPH—September 9, 1864

#### Williamsburg Male and Female Institute

Our Academic year opens on September 19, 1864. This year is divided into two sessions of 20 weeks each.

The course of study comprises Orthography, Penmanship, Grammar, Geography, Reading, Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, History, Science of Government, Physiology, Mythology, Familiar Science, English Composition, Natural Philosophy, Chemistry, Robins, Out lines, Kame's Elements, Rhetoric, English, Literature, Botany, etc.

## **New KCHS Education Grant Program**

The Kingdom of Callaway Historical Society is pleased to offer grants in 2024 for history-related learning activities to all educators in Callaway County schools (Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup> grade). Grant awards will be up to \$1000 each and will provide funds for the 2024-25 school year. Staff of accredited Callaway County public or private schools are eligible to apply. All subject areas will be considered, as long as the project has a clearly defined historical component.

The grant application is available on the KCHS website and was sent to a representative of each school in early January to distribute. Grant applications are due by March 15.

#### Benefits of the grant program:

- The Society will increase awareness of our services for Callaway educators and their students during the grant process;
- Educators will be able to access funds for history-related learning activities that would not be possible within their budgets;
- The Society will encourage a multidisciplinary approach to the grant process, inviting history, language arts, humanities, and other educators to develop grant projects;
- Grant recipients will be invited to showcase their projects at the Society Annual Meeting or other appropriate KCHS event.

Funding for the grants is made possible through the proceeds of the 2023 Pie Supper and Auction. Our thanks to the many people who attended and made it a success.
